

mid-90s and humidity at 80 percent, Airmen with the Air Force Technical Applications Center stood in early morning formation to render a welcoming salute to their new commander, Col. Steven M. Gorski. The nuclear treaty monitoring center held an assumption of command ceremony July 25 in front of the center's state-of-the-art headquarters building, as Gorski ac-

cepted the unit's guidon from 25th Air Force commander Maj. Gen. Bradford "BJ" Shwedo. Gorski, a career intelligence officer, graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1996 with a degree in physics. In 2002, he was selected to attend the Air Force Institute of Technology, where he earned a master's degree in engineering physics. "AFTAC has an amazingly gifted team that continually 'wows' senior leadership all the way up to the president of the United States," said Shwedo. "Col. Gorski is equally amazing and is up to the task to lead this center. AFTAC personnel awarded Nuclear Deterrence medal

PATRICK AIR FORCE BASE, Fla. -- The Air Force Nuclear Enterprise Functional Authority has authorized personnel from the Air Force Technical Applications Center here the award of the Nuclear Deterrence Operations Service Medal effective April 13, 2016.

The medal is awarded to Airmen who have directly impacted the nuclear enterprise and directly support nuclear deterrence operations.

The medal, which was first approved in May 2014 by the Secretary of the Air Force, is predominantly blue with yellow, green and red stripes, and contains a laurel wreath surrounded by a nuclear symbol. The reverse has a circular inscription that reads, "Nuclear Deterrence Operations Service."

"I'm pleased that AFTAC has been formally recognized for its contributions to nuclear deterrence," said Chief Master Sgt. Michael Joseph, AFTAC's command chief. "Former and current AFTAC Airmen in delineated Air Force Specialty Codes who served with the center for 120 consecutive days or more since Dec. 27, 1991, qualify and are fully authorized to wear the ribbon."

The retroactive date – Dec. 27, 1991 – was selected as a result of the dissolution of the Soviet Union the day before on Dec. 26, 1991.

In order of precedence, the NDOSM is worn between the Air and Space Campaign Medal and the Air Force Overseas Service Ribbon (Short Tour). An "N" device will be worn by Airmen who meet the criteria outlined in Air Force Instruction 36-2803. The medal does not have point value for the Weighted Airman Promotion System.

Active duty Airmen who qualify for the medal can apply on the MyPers website (https://mypers.af.mil). Airmen who have retired or separated, or their surviving family members, can submit a Standard Form 180 with supporting documentation to the Air Force Personnel Center, AFPC/DPSIDR, 550 C Street, Joint Base San Antonio, Texas 78150.
