

Celestis Memorial Spaceflight #17 – Horizon mission was successfully launched on 24 January 2021.

Why is that important to some Alumni? One of own, Major Michael Welham was aboard.

Mike was battling pancreatic cancer. During his last few weeks, Mike told his wife that he didn't really want a funeral and preferred to be remembered as he was before the cancer. So together Mike and his wife found out about Celestis from good, old-fashioned googling. This option sounded so unique and was a way to honor Mike and his work with NASA.

His ashes were in a capsule with 103 others aboard the Spaceflight Industries Sherpa-FX 1 spacecraft, one of the payloads included on the Falcon 9 rocket "Transporter 1" mission.



Rest in peace Mike we will miss you!

#### **Covid-19 Vaccinations**



Long but informative.

All Adults in the U.S. Eligible to Make a **COVID-19 Vaccine Appointment on April** 19, 2021

The President recently announced that all adults in the United States are eligible to make appointments to receive the COVID- network and non-network pharmacies. 19 vaccine as of April 19th.

#### COVID-19 Vaccine for Eligible Adults at DOD Vaccination Sites

As of April 19, all Department of Defense (DOD) beneficiaries can make an appointment, as available, to get the COVID-19 vaccine at DOD vaccination sites. As a TRICARE beneficiary, you are eligible and authorized to get a vaccine at any DOD vaccination site.

You can get a COVID-19 vaccine at any military hospital, clinic, or DOD vaccination site that offers the vaccine, even if it's not where you normally get care.

- The number of open appointments will vary by vaccination site. This is because sites are getting different amounts of vaccine doses.
- · Visit the TRICARE DOD COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments page to see what appointment tools your military hospital or clinic is using.

If you're in a priority tier and you haven't gotten your vaccine yet, COVID-19 Vaccine Documentation you should make your appointment now.

If you get the vaccine, you'll reduce your risk of becoming severely ill with COVID-19.

#### Where Else Can I Get the COVID-19 Vaccine?

You have other options on where to get the vaccine, depending on local availability. Appointments are required at most locations.

Visit VaccineFinder.org to find clinics, pharmacies, and other locations that offer COVID-19 vaccines near you. For some states, information is still limited; providers and pharmacies will continue to update locations in the coming weeks.

Besides going to a DOD vaccination site, you can also get a COVID-19 vaccine at:

· Your state or local health department COVID-19 vaccination

sites

- · Your civilian provider
- Retail pharmacies
- · To see a list of pharmacies that may have COVID-19 vaccines, visit the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Federal Retail Pharmacy Program page.
- You can get a COVID-19 vaccine at no cost at TRICARE

#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments at DOD Vaccination Sites**

DOD vaccination sites may extend their hours, including evenings and weekends, to offer more vaccine appointments.

The TRICARE DOD COVID-19 Vaccine Appointments website shows how to request an appointment at a DOD vaccination site. www.tricare.mil/VaccineAppointments to see appointment tools each DOD vaccination site is using and use one of those tools to make an appointment.

If a site isn't listed, visit your local military hospital or clinic's website for information.

#### What Does the COVID-19 Vaccine Cost?

The vaccine itself is offered at no cost, but based on your plan and status (active duty or retiree), there may be a cost for an office visit to a TRICARE-authorized or network provider or if you require follow-on care.

While there is no charge for the vaccine, if you get a vaccine while seeking care (a diabetes check-in, for example), then a visit copayment or cost-share will apply.

You must bring your vaccination card to your second vaccine appointment for record keeping.

Once the COVID-19 vaccination process is completed, submit documentation to your provider so it can be added to your health record.


## **AFTAC Memorial**

### THE AFTAC MEMORIAL

The AFTAC memorial Corporation (AFTACMC) (a Florida non-profit 501(C)3 corporation) has for the past 32 months been conducting a fund raising to construct a memorial to those AFTACers who have passed away while serving in AFTAC. The proposed design has previously been published in the Post Monitor and is on the AFTAC Web Site (AFTACAA.US). When we began the process there was a large voicing of approval and comments of "when can we contribute?." Well, that time has definitely here!



In total, 56 donations have been received to date in support the building of the memorial. Individual donors number 49 and 7 are organizations. The individual donations range from \$30.00 to \$10.150.00. Organization donations range from \$300.00 to \$10,000.00. The FL Alumni Chapter numbers around 583, CO Chapter around 100 and CA Chapter around 140 members. The e-all (email roster) has approximately 1100 listings.

As of the date of this article, the AFTACMC has approximately \$43,000.00 in the building fund (including two pledges). The estimated cost to build the proposed Memorial is \$150,000 to \$180,000. So you can see we are still a long way off.

I know that many, if not all, have very fond memories of their time in AFTAC, many with their entire military and/or civilian service time in AFTAC. Many of you have known and/or have served with those members who have died while working at AFTAC.

So once again we ask each of you to look deep into your heart and soul, as well as your checkbook to consider a donation to make this Memorial happen. It can only happen with YOUR help.

Donations in any amount are appreciated, the designation levels are \$1-\$149 - Donor, \$150-999- Brick, \$1000-2400-Bronze, \$2500-\$4999- Silver, \$5000-\$9999- Gold, and \$10,000-up - Platinum Donations for any amount can be made by a check made out to "AFTAC Memorial Corporation" and mailed to
